2022 presented our Head Start programs with challenges unforeseen in Head Start – entering the third year of keeping children and staff safe during the pandemic and a workforce crisis forcing programs to operate with one out of every five jobs vacant. And yet, Head Start continued to serve. The most vulnerable children and families saw the benefits of high-quality early education and comprehensive services in Head Start and Early Head Start classrooms, home visits, family child care, and partner programs. Thousands of young children were screened for health and mental health needs and received needed interventions, children were fed nutritious meals and snacks, families were supported through homelessness and job training, and more.

Head Start continues to serve the most vulnerable because of the hardworking, dedicated staff working in relationship with children and families at each of the 29 programs in Massachusetts. Head Start and Early Head Start teachers, home visitors, family advocates, cooks, bus drivers, and countless others provide lifechanging value to the families in the Commonwealth most in need. These Head Start heroes show up each day to serve.

Head Start

The foundation of Head Start is simple:

Every child, regardless of circumstances at birth, has the ability to reach their full potential.

Head Start was founded in 1965 as a tool to help break the cycle of poverty by providing low-income parents with early childhood education and comprehensive family services. Head Start has expanded to include children birth-3 and now serves approximately one million children a year in all 50 states, including over 10,000 children in Massachusetts. Head Start programs promote children's development through comprehensive and community based services. Head Start comprehensive services include:

- Health, mental health, nutritional, and educational services for children
- Leadership, volunteer, and parent education opportunities
- Referrals and family advocacy

Head Start programs prepare children for Kindergarten success and provide vital supports for their families according to the unique communities' needs. While maintaining the original vision of communities investing in their youngest, most vulnerable children, Head Start has also developed over the decades to adapt, build on evidence-based practices, and continually improve to provide the highest quality programs for children and families.

Head Start provides high-quality comprehensive services to ensure children are ready to learn and families can succeed.

Education and Child Development

Head Start programs provide the highest-quality early education and care using evidence-based curricula. Worcester Child Development Head Start is a Reggio Emilia inspired program which focuses on recognizing that every person is unique and has strong potential. Their curriculum works in collaboration with community, families, children, and each other to ensure that people feel their value as citizens in the community.

Health

Children's health is a top priority for Head Start. Programs collaborate with families to make sure children receive all appropriate medial and dental care, facilitate any necessary diagnostic testing, and receive vision and hearing screenings.

Family Services

Comprehensive family services are at the core of Head Start's mission, and include services such as housing assistance, ESL training, and job training. Since 2018, Holyoke Chicopee Springfield Head Start has joined forces with Springfield WORKS to prepare parents, guardians, and families for entering the workforce. This Whole Family Approach to Careers initiative promotes economic and family stability.

Disability Services

All Head Start programs reserve at least 10% of their slots for children with disabilities. Programs partner with families, Early Intervention providers, and school districts to ensure individualized services and full participation for all children.

Mental Health

The mental health of children and the adults that care for them is essential for school readiness. Head Start programs partner with mental health consultants to identify and support children, as Head Start programs are uniquely qualified to address trauma and promote resilience in young children and families.

Nutrition

Head Start programs provide healthy meals and snacks for children, making sure their bellies are full and ready to learn. Programs maintain partnerships with local, state and regional agencies to offer resources to support healthy eating habits and nutritional assistance information to share with families.

Family and Community Engagement:

Families are Head Start's most important partners, and programs integrate parents and families into all aspects of their services. ABCD Head Start uses a Home School Connections approach to family engagement, bringing out-of-school learning and classroom learning together. This approach has allowed ABCD to build a support system for children and families that includes family experience, knowledge, and resources, creating a culture of excitement and empowerment.




